1	Examine exterior of tank including fittings and valves for leaks, signs of corrosion, and correct as needed.			
2	Test air pressure in tank. Ensure air pressure is at correct PSI. Correct as needed.			

Note: The technician shall perform any repairs identified during PM up to \$250 (direct labor and direct material cost) per PM occurrence. For any deficiencies found exceeding \$250 open a corrective maintenance (CM) ticket and include the Asset #, WO #, photos, and a detailed description of the deficiency.
